Settled in 1833 and incorporated in 1844, Chagrin Falls quickly became a manufacturing and cultural center. Within a stretch of about one mile, 9

dams were constructed which powered grist mills, axe factories, woolen mills, paper mills, planing mills and woodenware mills. Within

20 years of being settled, Chagrin Falls was a bustling community with numerous churches, a library and the center of activity for the surrounding communities. The various tours of Chagrin Falls will acquaint you with the pioneers, mill owners, business owners and others that made this town so unique in the Western Reserve.

WEST SIDE:

EST. 1974

The West Side Historic District encompasses a wide variety of architectural styles. The majestic Italianate homes of the wealthy mill owners and businessmen, Queen Ann, Eastlake, Vernacular, Hall and Parlor, Greek Revival are all present in the district.

Originally all wood structures, the business district was periodically decimated by fires. Between 1860 and 1875

the majority of downtown structures were replaced by


